Community Speed Watch

GWPC receives a number of complaints from residents regarding the speed of vehicles travelling in the 30mph zones in the village. Unfortunately, it is not within the powers of the Parish Council to initiate the type of schemes that you would like to see implemented.

However, Great Waldingfield is part of the Community Speed Watch scheme run in conjunction with Acton, Little Waldingfield, Chilton, Newton and Boxford but the reason it has only conducted one survey in the past 2 years is that it cannot get 3 volunteers to operate the scheme.

If you want to reduce the speed of vehicles travelling through Great Waldingfield why not join the Community Speed Watch team. All you have to commit to is a minimum of 1 hour every 4 weeks. You will need to complete an application form to join the scheme but once accepted full training will be provided.
